DOMESTIC TRAVEL



UNITED STATES

- Avoid all international travel due to the global impact of COVID-19. Restrictions and quarantine apply if travelers have been to hot spot areas in the past 14 days.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL



AUSTRALIA

- Travelers from the U.S. that are allowed to enter, will be required to produce a negative COVID-19 PCR test certificate issued within the last 72 hours before arrival. If Passengers are not able to test before arrival, they will be required to be tested within 48 hours after arrival and must undergo self-quarantine until test results are available.
- Passengers are subject to testing and a 14 days quarantine at a designation location. Passengers allowed to enter must request an exemption before departure at <https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/help-support/departamental-forms/online-forms/covid19-enquiry-form>.
- Melbourne airport closed until at least October 24, 2020
- Passengers transiting through Australia for 8 – 72 hours are subject to quarantine until their departing flight.

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BELGIUM

- Passengers from the U.S. are not allowed. Some exceptions apply
- Any transiting passenger must have evidence of onward travel and valid identification/proof of residence.
- A completed Passenger Locator Form must be submitted at most 48 hours before arrival.
- Passengers are subject to medical screening and quarantine

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BRAZIL

- Brazil has reopened air borders. Foreigners are now allowed to enter by air, except at airports in Matto Grosso do Sul, Paraiba, Rondonia, Rio Grande do Sul, and the Tocantins.
- Travelers who are staying up to 90 days must present a visa and proof of health insurance before boarding their flight at point of origin.
- Travelers are permitted to transit through Brazil as long as they do not leave the transit area and possess an onward ticket
- Some exceptions apply

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CANADA

- The Canadian government extended cross-border travel restrictions with the U.S. until Sept. 30, 2020. Foreign travelers travelling for a non-essential reason are barred from entering until if a traveler does not have an essential reason to travel, they may be denied entry.
- Passenger must provide basic contact information
- Foreign nationals must prove they are exempt from travel restriction, are traveling for an essential reason, and are not presenting signs or symptoms of Covid-19.
- Passengers at Calgary, Montreal, Toronto-Pearson, and Vancouver airports must undergo compulsory temperature checks before entering departure security screening
- Passengers are subject to quarantine for 14 days

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CHINA

- The mainland of China has decided to temporarily suspend the entry into the mainland of China by Foreign Nationals –exceptions apply
- All travelers will be screened and subject to 14 day quarantine. The quarantine location could be a government-selected facility or hotel at the traveler's expense
- U.S. citizens are required to install location tracking applications on their phones to access different public places and businesses
- Passengers arriving PEK require testing and are subject to 14 day quarantine.
- As of September 7, travelers must provide a negative COVID-19 test certification taken no more than 3 days prior to arrival



FRANCE

- Passengers from the U.S. are not allowed to enter – exceptions apply
- Passengers must complete a declaration on honor to state that they do not have symptoms of Covid-19
- Passengers are subject to quarantine or isolation

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FINLAND

- Passengers from the U.S. are not allowed to enter Finland – exceptions apply.

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GERMANY

- Germany is limiting entry to EU citizens and residents.

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INDIA

- All international commercial flights are banned until at least Sept. 30, 2020. Domestic flights are operating at a reduced frequency
- Exceptions apply

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ITALY

- Passengers from the US are not allowed to enter until October 7, 2020 – exceptions apply
- Passenger must complete a self-declaration form prior to boarding – www.esteri.it/mae/resource/doc/2020/08/self-declaration_in_case_of_entry_into_italy_from_abroad_form_14_08.pdf
- Passengers allowed to enter are subject to self-quarantine for 14 days

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JAPAN

- Passengers coming from the US (plus other countries) are not allowed to enter, exceptions apply
- Passengers transiting through Tokyo (NRT) must transit on the same day
- Travelers are subject to 14 day quarantine

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KOREA (REPUBLIC OF)

- Passengers traveling as tourists are not allowed to enter.
- Passengers traveling on business are subject to 14 day quarantine.
- Travelers transiting through South Korea will be screened on arrival for symptoms

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NETHERLANDS

- Passengers from the U.S. are not allowed to enter the Netherlands – exceptions apply.

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PORTUGAL

- Passengers from the U.S. are not allowed to enter – exceptions apply.
- Travelers must present proof of a negative Covid-19 test conducted in the last 72 hours

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TAIWAN

- Passengers are only allowed to transit through Taiwan Taoyuan International Airport (TPE) with the following restrictions: Flights from and to China excluded, transit passengers must fly with China Airlines, EVA air, or Cathay Pacific and must fly with the same carrier in and out of Taipei, transit passengers must depart Taiwan within 8 hours.
- Passengers are not allowed to enter Taipei – exceptions apply.
- Passengers are subject to testing and quarantine

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UNITED KINGDOM

- Passengers are subject to self-quarantine for 14-days.
- A completed “Public Health Passenger Locator Form” must be presented to immigration upon arrival.
